Gospel Reflection Third Sunday of Lent

Since it is outside the covenant that Jesus establishes, he is the answer; he is the promised Messiah who will fulfill the covenant and invites us to join the covenant he has maintained with his people all along, enabling us to truly become the people of God. One key takeaway is that, given the nature of the story and the people's understanding, many things become clearer. However, one thing is unmistakably clear: you are on holy ground, not because you're in church, but because God is everywhere. And if God is everywhere, it means that everywhere is holy ground. And if God is one with His people, He is also one with all the people in the world, for all that He has

created He loves as His very own. If it happens to be nature, it is nature. But He also deeply loves all the people that He has created and has given them the power to love or refuse love.

That is why we learn about this during Lent. We must begin to take the world seriously. And the world is taken seriously when we understand that everyone we touch, encounter, or who enters or exits our lives is made in the image of God and is one with Jesus, our Savior. When we treat others well, we touch God and invite Him into our hearts. However, when we spurn, ignore, or let them go their own way, we not only lose their friendship but we also disconnect from God Himself. That is why Jesus says, "The only commandment," referring to the covenant commandment, "the only commandment now is that you must love one another as I have loved you." The commandment is: "Love God, love your neighbor." It is, in fact, just one commandment. Today, we approach Lent. During Lent, we must revise one aspect of our understanding of our faith. Faith is based on wonder, not on following rules or regulations. It is based on awe. When Moses and the Hebrews spoke of fear, they didn't mean being afraid of God. "God-fearing" refers to the awe that comes from the knowledge that God would descend upon us, take up our lives, and walk with us through our world, touching it and healing it. This is because we are the messengers of His love, and we are the ones through whom He will perform the miracle of one God under heaven and one family among all mankind. So, when we hear this story today, we must remember who Jesus is. He is the one who makes us wonder and helps us understand the sacredness of the world and its people. And no matter how much we tarnish it, and no matter how much we refuse to accept it, we know that the only response is the response of Jesus and the Father who said He loved this world so much that He gave His only Son to die for it, to heal it, to save it, and to bring it home.

Therefore, when we speak of serving God, we are really serving ourselves. For when we serve each other, we touch God. When we love each other, we love God. When we dismiss each other, we dismiss God. This is the one irrevocable understanding of Christianity and Judaism: that God came to live our lives with us, sharing in the good, the bad, the difficult, and the painful. Never alone, always struggling, yet also full of awe and wonder that such a God exists and recognizing that all the wonders of the world are His gifts for us to care for, nurture, and love. This kind of unhappy story, in a way, is the essence of all Christian joy. We rejoice in the Lord always because we know that He has united us with Him, with all humanity, and with the world in His love.

So we approach Lent with the understanding, this wonderful understanding, and say: "What can I do during this season of springtime with love, that I might become more and more aware of the grace of God which is everywhere?"

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, and Good Friday, April 18, 2025, are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.



The Scrutinies in the Period of Purification & Enlightenment (OCIA)

The risen Jesus said to them "All power in heaven & on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, & make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, & of the Son, & of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28: 18-20). The Apostles obeyed him, & the Church obeys him & continues Christ's high priestly work of redemption until the end of the age. Christ came to give us life & give it more abundantly (John 10:10). Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us, & above all, in the sacraments he gives us the more abundant Christian life. The Church lives & grows by the sacraments, especially the Mass; sharing in Christ's life to love God above all & to love our neighbor as Christ loves us.

The Scrutinies are rites celebrated on the 3rd 4th & 5th Sundays of Lent by those people who are preparing to be baptized, confirmed & receive First Holy Communion in the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. They are called "elect." All of us members are "elect" because we are chosen (elected) by God & have been called by Christ to the Easter sacraments. Historically, as Christ worked thru his humanity always doing good, reconciling the human family to God, in the Church's sacraments, he continues to do his high priestly work in doing good for us healing, forgiving, exorcising, sanctifying & giving us new life with him. Jesus glorifies God the Father & saves souls thru the sacraments!

The Scrutinies are described by the Church as rites for self-searching, looking within, & repentance. The rites are meant to uncover, than heal all that is weak, defected, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out & then strengthen all that is upright, strong & good in the elect. The priest offers prayers for the elect & celebrates the Scrutinies in order to deliver them from the power of sin & Satan, to protect them against temptation, & give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth & the life. Jesus calls us to conversion. "The time is fulfilled, & the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, & believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:15). Conversion, our turning to God, by God's grace, happens continuously. We stumble & fall, we sin, but God is always compassionate & merciful & helps us get back up & try again. The candidates, who are already baptized, will go to the sacrament of Confession/Reconciliation during this Period of Purification & Enlightenment.

The Gospels on the 3 Sundays are: The first Gospel (the Samaritan woman at the well), tells us that Christ & his Holy Spirit is the living water; the second Gospel (the healing of the man born blind), tells us that Christ is the Light of the world; & the third Gospel (the raising of Lazarus from the dead), tells us that Christ is the Resurrection & the Life. Jesus described the purpose of his mission is "to give life in abundance". Each of the Gospels proclaimed in the 3 Scrutinies illustrates this.






