#### Gospel Reflection 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

I believe we understand how Peter feels. After a long and fruitless night, he's feeling tired and disappointed. He and his crew have worked hard until dawn to catch fish, only to return home empty-handed. We've all invested time, energy, and resources into pursuits that just didn't pan out: perhaps a special project at work or something as dear and vital as a relationship. We've experienced

failure, in one form or another. A friend of mine shares that after 30 years of marriage and raising a family, her husband has found someone else and has left. "It's a done deal," she says with a sigh. And in that sigh, decades of building a life together vanish into thin air.

When marriages collapse, when careers are pink-slipped into oblivion, when finances are shattered and homes lost, we find ourselves on the shore like Peter, picking seaweed out of our nets and feeling used or betrayed. What was the purpose of our striving? Was it all for nothing? How many of us are prepared, in the dawn of our great emptiness, to try again? Which of us would step back into our boats and head back out to open waters and lower those nets? That takes hope. You have to believe in love's potential, or "the cause," or whatever it is that made you willing to fish in the first place. You have to hold onto the be in the existence of fish, at the very least!

The vocation of a spouse to be faithful, or a parent to love and nurture, or a pastor to reap God's harvest, or a worker to build, create, or serve—all have the same goal, which is fruitfulness. We don't want to be wasted. We don't want to look back on our lives with a sigh, like my friend whose marriage seems to have evaporated. An anonymous American poet composed a poem of only two lines: "I wish that I had died for love/But I didn't." None of us wants that as an epitaph! We want to *live* for love, at least, so that we can leave this world in the certainty of our fruitfulness.

If we sometimes find ourselves like Peter in the daybreak of disappointment holding empty nets, we have to be like Peter also in his willingness, at a word from Jesus, to go back out there and lower our nets again. This action separates disciples from pretenders. Disciples trust, even when their nets are empty, that there are fish out there to be caught. Disciples don't measure fruitfulness by individual successes or failures but by their faithfulness. Our trust remains not in what we can do but in what *God* can do.




