

Gospel Reflection

In the past, the Christmas season was almost as long as Lent. It would last 40 days, beginning on Christmas day and ending on the feast we are celebrating today, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This day was picked to mark the end of Christmas because so many of the themes we celebrate at Christ's birth are picked up again when Mary brings her 40-day-old child to the Temple in Jerusalem. So, as we celebrate this feast, it is a good idea to reflect on it with an eye to the Christmas holy day we celebrated 40 days ago.

On Christmas Day, it is the figure of the shepherds who receive the good news of a Savior born in Bethlehem. Today, we are introduced to Simeon and Anna. Saint Luke tells us that they were faithful and devoted Jews who prayed in the Temple and anticipated the coming of the Messiah. In fact, the Holy Spirit promised Simeon that he would see the Messiah before he died. This is why he welcomed Mary and took Jesus in his arms with such joy. The great desire of his heart had been fulfilled in that child.

Simeon and Anna represent everyone who seeks God with sincerity and devotion. This longing is fulfilled in one person—
Jesus Christ, who was born in Bethlehem and presented in the Temple. He is "God with us," the God who became a child so
that He could be taken into our arms, just as Simeon did. That means that anyone who is looking for real meaning and
purpose in life should look no further than Jesus Christ. Living for Him is the way to find our true purpose. That also means
that anyone searching for the truth can find it in Jesus Christ. He is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life." When we follow Him,
we walk in the light of Truth itself. This is why Simeon refers to Him as "a light of revelation to the nations." Because He is
God made man, He alone can reveal to us the truth about God. In that light, everything else becomes clearer, including the
truth about us.

Finally, Jesus Christ is the answer to every heart that searches for love. All of us were created to love and be loved. No one can love us more than the God who created us. In Jesus Christ, the love of God is revealed. God loved us so much that He sent His only Son to be born in the humblest of circumstances and to die in the most painful way. All for us. The confidence that we are loved by God helps heal all the wounds we have from people who have hurt and rejected us. We can face any difficulty when we are supported by the love of a God who will stop at nothing to provide for us. So, in this child Jesus, we find the meaning, the truth, and the love that all of us are yearning for.

During the Advent and Christmas seasons, we often speak about how Jesus not only came in the past but continues to visit us in the present. Today's feast echoes that reality. Simeon and Anna are so joyful because they were able to see the infant Jesus and hold Him in their hands. That event took place in Jerusalem over 2000 years ago.

However, Jesus continues to visit His people today. If simply seeing Jesus and cradling Him brought joy to Simeon and Anna, how much greater is what God offers us here today! We have Jesus in the Eucharist. Not only can we take Him in our hands, but we can also welcome Him into our bodies, and especially into our hearts. We can possess Him in our souls and bring Him home with us. This Messiah, for whom generations of Jews, like Simeon and Anna, waited with great longing, is here with us now, offering Himself to us in the Eucharist. The prophet Malachi proclaimed in today's first reading, "The Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to His temple" (Mal 3:1). That prophecy was fulfilled when Jesus was presented in the Temple in Jerusalem as described in today's Gospel. Yet, it is also fulfilled every day in churches around the world, where Jesus gives Himself to us in Holy Communion. Unlike Simeon and Anna, we don't have to wait for our Messiah. We don't have to go far to find Him. He is here. In fact, it turns out that He is waiting for us. He is waiting for us to visit Him and receive Him. He is waiting for us to turn to Him for comfort when we are tired and for strength when we are afraid. He is waiting for us to open our hearts and welcome Him. He wants to be presented into the Temple of our souls and to be loved by us.

If you don't know what it means to welcome Jesus into your heart, there is someone who can help you. Just as Mary brought Jesus into the Temple and put Him in the arms of Simeon, she can bring Jesus to us and offer Him to us. A simple prayer such as, "Mary, help me to welcome your Son into my heart," can help. Just as God used Mary to bring Jesus into the world, He continues to use her to bring Him into the hearts of believers. She was the first to make a home for Jesus in her body, and so she can teach us how to make a home for Jesus in the Eucharist. Another important way that we can learn how to welcome Jesus into our hearts is by making frequent visits to Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

Jesus comes to fulfill the desire of every human heart for love, truth, and meaning. And He is not hard to find. He is here, waiting for us to embrace Him with love. Jesus is the answer, and He is given to us in the Eucharist to be with us always. Let's receive Him with love and devotion and go from this place to share Him with others.





Blessing of the Throats Monday, February 3 at 8:15am Mass The Feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr

St. Blaise was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and was martyred in the year 316 AD. The oldest accounts tell us that Blaise was a physician at Sebaste before he was made Bishop. In the 4th century persecution of Licinius, St. Blaise was taken prisoner. The most popular story attributed to St. Blaise occurred while he was in prison, when he cured a young a boy who was in danger of choking to death because of a fishbone in his throat. That story, and the fact that St. Blaise was a doctor, made the saint very popular for intercessory prayer for throat ailments. At an early date, the veneration of this Eastern saint was brought into Europe, and Blaise became one of the most popular saints of the Middle Ages. Numberless churches and altars were dedicated to him. Saint Francis of Assisi Church will have the blessing of the throats Monday, February 3, 2025 at 8:15am Mass.


In the Parish Conference Room


